Host a Meeting with your organization's leadership and discuss the excellent work that you have done to achieve Interim Preliminary or Full Recognition.

• Share your NDPP results.

• Share the evidence of the Diabetes Prevention Program and that individuals engaged in the program can reduce their risk of developing diabetes by as much as 58%; and hence, reduce healthcare costs. www.cdc.gov/diabetes/prevention.



Coaches Obtain a National Provider Identifier (NPI)

from the National Plan and Provider Enumeration System (NPPES).

The Organization completes a Medicare Enrollment Application and pay the fee*. (even if the organization is already enrolled as a Medicare Provider, it must re-enroll).

*The fee is \$569. Organizations may apply for a hardship exemption to have the fee waived.
